- 18 Grants that target disadvantages students
- 19 Special needs students funds from local district
- 20 Currently there is 67 + million dollars of grants that is available through various physical education grants that directly fit this program ...all school systems have grant writers that can assist with this. The disadvantage the grants may take 6mts to a year to be awarded.
